Finally, and after a lot of work, letters, surveys and conversations, the Revista Chilena de Anestesia has been indexed in SCIELO (Scientific Electronic Library Online). This is one of the largest databases of scientific journals in the world. Its purpose was to work with Central and South America. It now includes Spain, Mexico and other countries. Its reach is to many millions of professionals, not only in the field of health, but also in many other interests for example art, literature, and others.

What had been hoped for many years, Dr. Carolina Cabrera Editor in Chief of our Journal, has achieved. Congratulations to her for this gigantic achievement and of course to the Editorial Committee that helps and advises in the activities of this publication.
